**A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL
OF THE TOWN OF LOOMIS ENCOURAGING THE CITY OF ROCKLIN TO
SUPPORT THE CREATION OF A REGIONAL PARK / PRESERVATION
AREA IN CLOVER VALLEY**

WHEREAS, Clover Valley is a pristine natural area totaling 622 acres with a year-round creek that is worth preserving as a natural park for public enjoyment; and

WHEREAS, Clover Valley contains important prehistoric Native American sites and other historical features; and

WHEREAS, a Clover Valley park / preserve would be enjoyed by Placer County residents and visitors along the major corridor of Sierra College Boulevard; and


WHEREAS, Clover Valley is environmentally rich in ecological and biological diversity, with the potential to be used by area schools and colleges; and

WHEREAS, a Clover Valley park / preserve is much preferred to additional housing development that would only create added traffic, air and noise pollution.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF LOOMIS, that the Council encourages the Rocklin City Council to assist the efforts of the Clover Valley Foundation and its supporters to acquire the property and create a park / preserve.




